

This year's celebration theme focused on the need to have strong leaders for better transformation in the sector. The theme was tamed



Visitors in our booth were intrigued by the way; our beneficiaries were supported and transformed their services through the Bank's support.

A visit by Regional Commissioner Hon. Anthony Mtaka visited our booth acknowledging the high professionalism spirit among TADB management.





#### **Day 03**








### Day 07

A visit by the Governor of Bank of Tanzania Professor Florens Luoga who was provided with information on how the Bank has positioned itself to support SHFs across the country.








